

Tobacco smoke exposure is a leading cause of morbidity and mortality for young children.

Physicians have a unique opportunity to screen and intervene in family smoking behavior. Anticipatory guidance provided by pediatric providers, especially to smokers during a critical time when they are more likely to quit compared to other smokers, can serve as a teachable moment instigating smokers to quit. However, tobacco smoke exposure (TSE) is not frequently addressed during office visits due to a lack of training, time and reimbursement.

The Ohio AAP's Smoke Free for Me Learning Collaborative aims to build upon the existing relationships between primary care providers and families by addressing caregiver and family member smoking behavior early in a child's life. An easy-to-implement screening tool has been developed to allow providers to seamlessly screen for family member smoking and utilize the 5As (Ask, Assess, Advise, Assist, and Arrange) to encourage smoking cessation.
